The North Lanarkshire Community and Voluntary Sector (CVS) Community Climate Pledge supports organisations to demonstrate their commitment and contribution to tackling the climate emergency and, by so doing, also support improvements to the environment and health.

How does the Pledge work?

To commit your organisation to this pledge, please select at **least two** actions listed on the next page. One of these actions must be **1. Raising Awareness and Commitment of Staff and Volunteers**

Benefits of Taking the Pledge

By taking this pledge, your organisation will become part of a collective local effort to help safeguard our planet and wellbeing now and for future generations. It will also support your organisation in various ways including:

Supporting future funding opportunities. Many funders are increasingly prioritising projects and initiatives that demonstrate a commitment to improving their climate impact.

Improving your organisation's reputation amongst staff, volunteers and the wider public by demonstrating your positive contribution to taking action on climate issues.

Supporting collaborations and partnership working. By signing this pledge we hope it can serve as a pathway to new collaborations with like-minded organisations and partners. These collaborations could lead to sharing of resources, expertise, and funding bids.

Our organisation will strengthen awareness and participation of our staff and volunteers in community climate action. This could include:



Our organisation will do the following:



Training an individual to become your Community Climate Champion.

Commit to hosting a climate conversation within your organisation/team.

Become an active member of the Community Climate Network.

Identify more climate friendly options for the materials and equipment we use and, as we purchase new materials and equipment, move to these climate-friendly options.

Manage waste generated by our organisation from our operations according to the principles of reduce, re-use and recycle. This could include one or more of the following actions:

Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy for Our Premises



overall - for example, use less paper and print less.



Commit to reducing our organisation's carbon emissions through improved energy efficiency measures and the use of renewable energy. We will do this either directly where we own our premises or with our landlord where we rent.

For example:

Implementing energy efficiency measures, such as installing LED light bulbs.

Switching to a renewable energy supplier and/or installing solar panels.

reduce our organisation's use of materials

reuse materials where possible – for example, stop using disposable plastic cups, plates and cutlery and provide reusable ones; repairing broken equipment.

recycling our waste materials such as paper, cardboard, plastic, glass and equipment.





Travel



Our organisation will reduce our carbon emissions from travelling to work and business travel by our staff and volunteers. We will promote active travel options, including two or more of the following:

Supporting our staff and volunteers to use public transport where possible.

Supporting our staff to cycle and walk where possible.

Car-sharing.



Supporting Wider Community Awareness and Action



Our organisation commits to supporting wider community awareness and action on climate issues through one or both of the following:

Facilitating community climate conversations with residents and/or other CVS organisations.

Participating in collective community climate action involving the local community and/or CVS organisations.

Supporting Nature and **Nature Connection**

Our organisation will support climate action and green wellbeing by taking action on one or more of the following:

Where we own or can manage an outdoor area, greening this area to include native trees and plants to suport wildlife and improve nature connectedness for our staff, volunteers, service users and wider communty.

Working with service users and/or local residents to support nature and nature connectedness through for example:

- Organising nature walks.
- Hosting nature-focused talks and activities such as plant and animal identification and nature crafts.
- Creating wildlife habitats like birdhouses, bat boxes, insect hotels.
- Initiating and/or supporting maintainance of a community garden.
- Organising or taking part in tree-planting.
- Supporting restoration and maintenance of nature walks and pathways.
